

Orange County Supervisor of Elections High School Leaders Focus Group

Purpose

- Organize and lead voter registration drives on high school campuses.
- Serve as a liaison between the Supervisor of Elections office and your school community to promote civic engagement.
- Inspire and empower fellow students to participate in the democratic process.

Focus Areas

- Work with the support and guidance of school leadership, student government, and other school stakeholders to strengthen outreach efforts.
- Coordinate at least two voter registration drives per school year at your high school.
- Share accurate information about voter eligibility, registration deadlines, and election dates.
- Collaborate with other Council members to share ideas for voter engagement.

Term Length

- Council members will serve for one school year.

Meeting Schedule

- The Council will meet three times during the school year either in person at the Orange County Supervisor of Elections office or virtually.

Liaison Support

- Two members of the Supervisor of Elections staff will serve as Council liaisons, providing training, resources, and coordination for registration drives.

Benefits of Serving

- Gain leadership experience and strengthen public speaking and organizational skills.
- Make a meaningful contribution to your school and community by promoting civic responsibility.
- Earn community service hours.

Applicant Criteria

- Be pre-registered or registered to vote.
- Be a current student in grades 11–12 at a public high school in Orange County.
- Be able to attend Council meetings and participate in school-based voter registration drives.
- Have an interest in civic engagement, leadership, and community service.
- Commit to upholding the nonpartisan mission of the SOE office.
- Represent the Council and the SOE office in a positive and professional manner.
